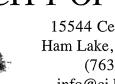

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CITY OF HAM LAKE CITY COUNCIL AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY MINUTES **MONDAY, DECEMBER 16, 2024**

The Ham Lake City Council and Economic Development Authority met for its regular meeting on Monday, December 16, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at the Ham Lake City Hall located at 15544 Central Avenue NE in Ham Lake, Minnesota.
